THE PRACTICE OF CLINICAL SUPERVISION Supervised practice is the cornerstone in the education and training of a psychologist (ASPPB Task Force on Supervision Guidelines, 1998; Russell & Petrie, 1994, p. 27). Clinical supervision is used in counselling, psychotherapy, and other mental health disciplines as well as many other professions engaged in working with people. Supervision may be applied as well to practitioners in somatic disciplines for their preparatory work for patients as well as collateral with patients.

Administrative supervision refers to those supervisory activities which increase the efficiency of the delivery of counselin g services, whereas clinical supervision includes the supportive and educative activities of the supervisor designed to improve the application of counseling theory and technique directly with clients.

Clinical supervision is acknowledged as a distinct professional competence that requires specific education and training. However, it is all too often an inadequately addressed or an entirely missing ingredient in psychology curricula and clinical research, including, for example, clinical trial protocols and evidence-based treatment implementation.

Clinical supervision is a formal and disciplined working alliance that is generally, but not necessarily, between a more experienced and a less experienced worker, in which the supervisee's clinical work is reviewed and reflected upon, with the aims of: improving the supervisee's work with clients; ensuring client welfare; supporting the supervisee in relation to their work, and supporting the supervisee's professional development.

Definition and Purpose - Clinical Supervision

Clinical supervision provides specific training on clinical skills including: assessment, diagnosis, treatment, termination, and ethical practice standards.
